Here is a look at initiatives for ELA this year.

ELA 20 – This is a great opportunity for ELA 20 teachers to network and collaborate on UbD planning, assessment, rubrics, and teaching strategies. There will be four inservice days as well as a division coach tied to the project.

What are the Treaty Essential Learnings (TEL)?

- TEL 1 Treaties: the who, what, where, when, and why of treaties
- TEL 2 Treaty Relationship: responsibilities and partners involved in the treaty relationship
- TEL 3 History: historical events in the treaty making process
- TEL 4 Worldviews: the differing worldviews of the treaty partners
- TEL 5 Symbolism: meaning behind the symbols and actions used in the treaty making process
- TEL 6 Contemporary Issues: new and current issues related to treaties.

In your school's Treaty Kit you will find grade levelled resources that were based on former SS objectives – be sure to look at the themes and topics in grade levels above and below your current grade as you may find additional information to support specific outcomes in renewed curriculum. For example, Grade 4 SS outcome DR4.3 is best supported with the grade 3 Treaty teacher guide. - ThoughtStream A new online survey tool that allows you to ask your class thoughtful questions and organize their answers for consensus and decision making. It's amazing for administrators or community school coordinators to survey staff and parents
- More Starfall Early years language and math development JUST renewed (thanks for your patience).
- GoApps The SRPSD version of Google Apps for Education has been nicknamed GoApps. The link is on the students link page for students to access email, make websites, collaborate on documents with others online, etc. More news as this develops next month
- StudentsAchieve 17 schools are using the new grade book now for K-8 students. All K-8 teachers will have full access for Sept 2013.
- SuccessMaker NEW by request at first, the CAT team coming up, and everyone after that! This online software supports student learning at their level with age appropriate themes and grade appropriate outcomes for math and ELA.
