

Wellness 10

Based upon the K-12 aims of health education and physical education, the purpose of Wellness 10 is to develop confident and competent students who understand, appreciate, and engage in a balanced, healthy, and active lifestyle. During Wellness 10, students achieve 10 outcomes. Seven of the outcomes are required and three of the outcomes are chosen from five optional outcomes provided (see Figure).

Using an outcomes-based gradebook will have you using outcomes as column headers instead of assignment names, have a list of your students, and have a place for you to put your 1,2,3,4 marks. It will also have a place for you to mark, note, or somehow keep track of the non-outcome based factors important to the development of the whole child ranging from motivation to organization to attitude.

Inside StudentsAchieve, these basic items are all handled for you. Here are a few tips for making the most out of the program:

- When entering marks for a stack of assignments, click the word "firstname" or "lastname" at the top of your columns of student names to reorganize your list of names. Sometimes you have assignments to enter and they are in a pile organized by the student's first names instead of their last. Reorganize your grade sheet for easy entry.
- If you can't see the "home" Getting Started tab and you want to go back, just close the screen. SA has multiple screens, don't be afraid to X out or close one to get back to the start.
- **Reports** is a tiny, fantastic word. When you are in the student analysis screen or the 'tree', you can print out whatever your heart desires. There are many new reports this month and many of them would be helpful for parent teacher interviews, interim reports for term 2, or for communicating individual needs.

The SRPSD 2012-2013 Learning Improvement Plans for all schools will soon be on the website. Administrators have worked diligently to ensure plans outline the mission, vision, demographics, governance structure, and programs & services for their schools. In addition, plans include a minimum of one school goal - complete with indicators, strategies, and actions.

As the school year progresses, I will be at every school three more times. School visits continue to create an opportunity to explore data results common throughout the school division – but unique to each school – and to determine how to best use student assessment data results as a critical component for student learning. Schools are encouraged to make changes to their plan throughout the school year, reflective of the work done in their efforts to reach student learning goals. This is meant to be a "live" document - acting as a guiding force and keeping momentum going towards improved learning outcomes and results for all students. It is a great tool to focus, highlight, and celebrate the meaningful work of school staffs.
