The Summer School Program	Prerequisites
 Daily attendance is compulsory for Math classes. Each student will work at his/her own rate in modular classes but attendance is advised as there will be a teacher/facilitator and reference materials available. Students may take more than one class but one is the recommended amount. At the completion of Summer School marks will be sent to Sask. Learning and report cards will be mailed out. NOTE: THE FIRST DAY OF CLASSES BEGINS AT CARLTON AT 8:00 A.M. IF YOU HAVE NOT PREVIOUSLY REGISTERED PLEASE COME TO THE SCHOOL AT 7:30 A.M. 	 Must have previously taken the course unless you are an adult student. Based on performance during the year, school principals may recommend a student for Summer School. May take a course for the first time at Summer School, providing they have the necessary prerequisites. Adult students welcome and do not require prerequisites. Adult students may also take 20 level science/math if it is the final credit required for completion of the Adult 12 program.
