

East Central students participate in "Tomatosphere"



ast Central's Grade 5/6 Class participated in Tomatosphere in May. This project is through the Canadian Space Agency for students all over North America. Classrooms in grades 2-10 conduct experiments to investigate the effects of the space environment on the growth of food (i.e. the tomato) that will

be one of the many foods used to support a long-term human mission, establishing a base on the Moon, and then to Mars. The CSA sent us 2 bags of seed labelled "G" and "W". One of the set was primed, which means that they have processed to the point of almost germinating and then stopped. Students had to determine which set of seeds germinated the fastest. No one knew which one except for the Space Agency. Students carefully planted and grew the tomato seeds to find out that "W" germinated the fastest. Everyone gets to take the plants home and eat tomatoes once they are ready... YUM !!!
