

What to do? What to do? This question was on the minds of 300 Saskatchewan Rivers Grade 7 students in January when they were presented with options for a unique learning experience. Carlton Comprehensive High School invited these students to come and be a part of their first Skills, Trades, and Technology Day. The Grade 7 students were given information about each of the 9 different trade and technology areas Carlton students were studying this term and were asked to choose two that they would like to experience firsthand.

Tuesday, February 24, 2009 was the long awaited day of opportunity. The Grade 7 students were bussed to Carlton and



partnered with a high school student who acted as their mentor for the day. Students quickly dispersed to their respective stations and after some instruction began trying their hand at new skills. The day saw students welding nuts and bolts people, experimenting with character make-up, and assembling blinking light kits. They experienced fingernail art, prepared creative cooking masterpieces, and built name plates out of wood. They also had the chance to complete a short multi-media project, machine a dog tag, and remove cylinder heads and crankcase covers from a small engine. At the end of it all, each student proudly took home their finished products.

With the shortage of skilled workers in our region and in the province, this day allowed the younger students to experience firsthand some of the different skills that are needed in the workforce. These students will be able to plan their high school programs so that they take advantage

# **'OUT OF THIS WORLD'** EXPERIENCE



Round and round we go!

Saskatchewan Rivers schools were treated to an 'out of this world' experience in late November when they became part of an elite group that were chosen to receive instruction from the Canadian Space Agency (CSA). Grades 5 to 8 students at Wild Rose School and Grade 7 students at Vincent Massey

Community School were among the students, in fewer than 50 schools

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across Canada, chosen to take part in an interactive session with the Space Agency.

At Wild Rose, Teacher *Leanne Tretiak* and her students worked through a 1½ hour workshop with Dr. Pat Sullivan (Space Science, Operational Space Medicine Group – Project Manager), learning about space flight and the effects on the neurovestibular system (a fancy name to describe the systems which help us balance, move, have correct posture, and stable vision). Dr. Sullivan was projected on Mrs. Tretiak's SMARTboard via the internet and a microphone was set up in her classroom so students could interact with him in real time during the presentation. The students had an opportunity to participate in a variety of hands-on activities to help deepen their understanding of the neurovestibular system in space.

Vincent Massey Community School students had a similar experience. *Paul Watson* and his class were engaged in a presentation entitled "The
