**Goal:** It is important that teachers have a common understanding of the components of effective communication, both in receiving it and expressing it. Content area material is often in a different text form than students are used to reading or writing. The content vocabulary may cause difficulty in comprehension and retention of material. Explicit, strategic instruction that follows the gradual release of responsibility model is important to assist student learning. Teaching reading and writing is not just for language arts/English teachers.

- understand the value of explicitly teaching reading, writing, speaking, listening, representing, and viewing strategies in their content area
  - value the alignment between ELA and their content area
  - are provided with instructional strategies to improve student achievement
  - set goals and share successes and improvements with others
