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Overview:
The course is built upon the work of Kevin Cameron and the Canadian Centre for Threat Assessment and Trauma Response. Serious violence is an evolutionary process and most students leave signs and indicators. The VTRA model is a multidisciplinary process of determining if a threat maker actually poses a risk to a target or targets they have threatened. Training involves school administrators, school social workers, police officers, and other related partners (community mental health, social services, probation, etc.) examining real case studies. Teams also assess students who already have histories of violence and are concerned about further and/or more serious violence potential.
