EQUIPMENT PURCHASING ACCOUNTING POLICY

In order for schools and School Community Councils to purchase equipment, a purchase requisition must be submitted to the Education Centre by the school principal. Purchasing personnel will issue a purchase order to acquire the equipment requested in order to ensure that the following issues are addressed:

 The equipment purchased meets current standards for use in schools. This includes the purchase of any computer hardware that is to be connected to the school division wide area computer

- network or to an individual computer workstation.
- 2. The equipment is included in the school division inventory for insurance purposes.
- 3. The school division is in position to deal with Public Sector Accounting Bodies standards governing equipment purchases.

The school division will purchase the equipment requested by a School Community Council and following receipt of the equipment, the School Community Council will reimburse the school division for purchases made under this policy from its funds.

THE TECHNOLOGY PLAN

OUR VISION

We envision using technology to further a learning community where students will:

- Experience technology integrated across the curriculum;
- Become ethical and informed consumers of media; and,
- Have access to teachers with the skills to be able to integrate technology.

There are 4 main principles of the technology plan.

- Facilitate learning with technology rather than learning about technology by providing access to and integrating technology in every K-12 classroom throughout the school division.
- Improve the access for students and teachers to the wealth of instructional materials and information

- that is available in digital form.
- Prepare teachers for integrating technology through ongoing professional development programs.
- Enhance teacher productivity through efficient administration.

OUR GOAL IS TO ENSURE THAT BY 2010:

- Every teacher in the Saskatchewan Rivers School Division has daily access to a computer;
- Just-in-time access to technology in a10:1 ratio for all students in the form of a cart of wireless laptops that can come to the classroom, or a pod of wireless laptops consistently in the classroom;
- Every grade K-8 classroom is equipped with a SMART board;

- Every grade K-8
 Classroom is equipped with a Sound Field system using infrared technology;
- Every 9-12 student has access to SMART board technology in the Math and Science areas and Sound Field systems using infrared technology;
- Practical and Applied Arts course offerings at the High School level are supported with desktop labs including appropriate video editing and/or drafting software; and,
- Technology is infused into the curriculum and every student has the opportunity to use technology to learn and demonstrate their learning on a daily basis.
