Here, the writer is guided by Cree values of 'Wakotowin' (Developing relations), 'Wichitowin' (Helping one another) and 'Sitoskatowin' (Unity). These Cree words are rooted within the northern landscape and reinforce Dr. Michell's worldview and thoughts on reconciliation. Includes bibliographical references (pages 144-146).
