SRPSD Response to the Truth and Reconciliation Calls to Action (b)

R. Bratvold outlined that the division has been responding in various ways to the Truth and Reconciliation Commissions calls to action in the past several years. Many of the Calls are directed towards federal and provincial governments, but SRPSD sees itself as an agent for reconciliation. The summary provided focuses on actions in the last 18 months, but includes some previous actions as well. It will be shared with the SSBA and others who request information. Some other suggestions to include in the summary were participation in the Orange Shirt Day, purchase of Treaty Six and Metis flags for all schools and the Education Centre, and the framed letter of apology for Indian Residential Schoos posted in all of our facilities.
