Distance learning follows the same curricula as face-to-face school and requires the same outcomes be met by the students. ### Requirements of Distance Learning

- Internet access and laptop or other device. Access to a printer and scanner is beneficial.
- Email address - yahoo is not compatible with SRPSD
- Dedicated time to support your child with their learning
- Distance learning is student driven and teacher supported. Parents play a very important role in this process.
- Assessments and report cards will be used to show achievement of outcomes just as your child would be receiving in a face-to-face classroom environment.
- Weekly schedules of learning activities and assessments will be provided. It is best that these are the focus of the week and parents provide a schedule for their child's day.
- Access to print material such as picture books and novels are also beneficial.

### Teacher's Role

- Teachers are available to support your child's learning throughout the regular school day.
- They are available through email to answer parent and/or student questions.
- Weekly video meetings with students.
- Monday morning email outlining the week.
- Teachers are also available to schedule individual video meetings to help support students in their learning.
- Teachers will provide course outlines for all subject areas.

### Access of Materials

- Moodle and Google Classroom will be the platforms for learning. You will access all lessons, videos, and assignments through these platforms. Seesaw may also be used at the K-3 level.
- At the high school level, students will receive a Moodle username and password from Sun West school division.
- K-8 students will be invited by their teachers to join google classroom and/or seesaw.
- All materials can be accessed online.
- Assignments will usually be uploaded through your online platform to your child's teacher.
