Meeting With The Minister of Education

As part of its advocacy efforts, the Board met with Minister Everett Hindley and MLAs Darlene Rowden and Kevin Kasun on October 16, 2025. The conversation focused on key points from the Board's advocacy plan and building an understanding of the unique needs of our school division. The Board also had the opportunity to highlight the successes and ongoing challenges in the division. The meeting was a valuable chance to engage directly with the Ministry and to advocate for the needs of our local schools.

Student Achievement & Learning Improvement Plans Accountability Reports

A group from John Diefenbaker Public School presented to the Board as part of Superintendent Jennifer Hingley's Accountability Reports. The group walked through their school's journey in building capacity with their staff through the use of SRPSD's learning models, key resources, and embedded coaching. The belief that through alignment of academic interventions and student engagement, the staff can positively influence student outcomes, as a strategy to increase student achievement at John Diefenbaker. Principal Jenna Cross shared the successes in their school with student reading results, as well as the improved culture and community in the school. The Board was highly engaged in the presentation and learned more about the effective learning strategies being built in our schools.
