A delegation from Wildrose Public School was welcomed to share their school improvement plan as part of the accountability report on Learning Improvement Plans presented by Superintendent, Jennifer Hingely. Former Principal Jennifer Ferguson, Inclusive Learning/Dreamcatcher Coach Leanne Gunderson, and current Principal Carrie Grant-Walker walked the Board through the changes in thinking and leading they have undergone to move the school forward to better meet the needs of their students in literacy.
