École Vickers Public School Leadership Team Showcases Learning Improvement and Student Achievement

A delegation from École Vickers Public School made a presentation to bring the work of school improvement and increasing student achievement to life for the Board. Principal Jennie Green and Vice Principal Chelsie Bergen talked about the journey their school has been on over the past 4 year to develop effective practice in teaching mathematics and increase student achievement in the subject area. Using research based best practices and resources to support them their math classrooms have transformed using vertical surfaces and collaborative methods. Teachers have taken on the resource MathUP and the pedagogies around Building Thinking Classrooms to elevate their work and in turn bring student achievement from the 70th percentile into the 80th percentile and maintained this achievement for the last 3 years. Superintendent Jennfier Hingely thanked the team for bringing to life the work described in her accountability reports which were also presented to the Board in their regular meeting.
