Board Advocacy Plan Celebrating Successes

The Board reviewed the progress of their advocacy plan. The successes shared included several meetings with elected officials and a face-to-face meeting with the Minister of Education. The Board was able to share both successes and challenges, including advocacy related to funding distributions for vulnerable students, support for learning shortfall, and discussions on the Sask DLC and funding for major capital projects. The Board is looking forward to upcoming meetings with the City of Prince Albert and the Annual Community Engagement event with SCC, the SRSC, and school administration.

Invitational Shared Services Initiatives Show Strong Partnerships with Indigenous Neighbors

Superintendent Jennifer Hingley shared highlights from the 2024/25 final reports for the Division's Invitational Shared Services Initiatives (ISSI) Partnerships. SRPSD has ISSI partnerships with Muskoday First Nation, Wahpeton Dakota Nation, and Montreal Lake Cree Nation. The highlights of these partnerships include successes in credit attainment for students attending SRPSD schools from Muskoday and a high level of trust and motivation built between grad coaches and students from both Muskoday and Wahpeton. The intent of the Montreal Lake ISSI is one of knowledge sharing, and the highlight of this partnership is that 79 SRPSD teachers have attended land-based learning professional development over the year, which is an increase from 33 teachers in the previous year.

Trach Sports Academy Partnership

This year, the Division has partnered with Jordan Trach and his team to bring their well-respected expertise in skill development and athletic training to our program. Trach Sports Academy has stepped into the Division, helping athletes reach their goals through high-level coaching and training. Their experience and passion for sports prove to be a valuable asset to our students. Superintendent Jeff Court shared with the Board that the partnership has already proven to be an asset to our student athletes. The program has grown this year, including approximately 80 students from grades 6 through 12 in the hockey program and 25 in grades 9 through 12 in the multi-sport program.
