### **Affinity Credit Union Scholarship**

Affinity Credit Union, Shellbrook District is offering two \$750.00 and two \$500.00 entrance scholarships to all graduation students of Canwood, Leask, Blaine Lake and Shellbrook who will be attending any post secondary education.

*Criteria:*

- *Applicants or their immediate family (parent or guardian) must be a member of Affinity Credit Union for at least one year prior to the application date.*
- *Proof of fulltime enrollment is required from any post secondary institution prior to disbursement of funds.*
- *The scholarships will be drawn for by lot with the application deadline of July 1<sup>st</sup>.*

### **Vance Tait Memorial Scholarship \$300.00**

Vance was a member of the Kinsmen Club of Shellbrook who lost a courageous battle with leukemia. With Vance's strong community spirit in mind, the Kinsmen established the Vance Tait Kinsmen Memorial Scholarship in his memory. This scholarship is to be given to a student in our community with the same strong morals that were displayed by Vance. Students apply directly to the Kinsmen to be considered for this award.

*Criteria:*

- *Applications include a letter of reference, a completed application form and an essay on "Why Volunteerism is Important."*

Students need to fill out:

- personal information
- proposed program of study
- extra-curricular activities
- community service and volunteer activities

Selection committee is the Kinsmen Group of Shellbrook who awards the scholarship to the applicable candidate.

Deadline is May 30 of current school year

### ***Brian "Mr. T" Tremblay Scholarship - Combining Athletics and Academic Excellence (on behalf of the Tremblay and Parent families)***

Mr. Brian Tremblay, or referred to as Mr. T, taught at W.P Sandin school for 11 years until his passing in February 2013.

Mr T. had a desire for learning. His first step along his academic journey consisted of a high school diploma. Then applying to the University of Saskatchewan and enrolling three years in the College of Engineering for Electrical Engineering, one year of Commerce and further obtaining a Bachelor of Physical Education Degree and Bachelor of Education Degree with a major in mathematics.

He wanted the same for his students and encouraged them to continue to learn as he did, and he was a demonstration of his values and beliefs. His passion for learning resonated out of the school and into his personal life. He loved seeing students learn skills that were applicable not just in school, but also in life.

He recognized life needed a consistent balance between academics and athletic involvement and with that came sport. With Mr. T, the more variety the better, whether it be a team sport like football, individual like snowboarding or a lifelong sport like cross country skiing and golfing, they were a major component of his life. He spent countless hours coaching team or individual sports and encouraged students to find their one or many sport and achieve to their potential.

*Criteria:*

- *Awarded to a student who demonstrates the same passion for learning and balances academics with involvement in sport. The grade 12 student must also be accepted into a post-secondary education program working toward a career that will ensure lifelong learning as Mr. T pursued.*
- *The candidate will be selected by the Tremblay and Parent families*

### ***Billy Simington Scholarship - \$250.00***

*Criteria:*

*The Billy Simington Scholarship is for a student who "achieves academically and has been involved in sports and school affairs as well as possessing leadership qualities". If there is not a student that fits these qualifications, then a student with a higher average can be selected.*

### ***Buckingham Security Services Scholarship - \$500***

Two awards will be awarded annually. These awards are for Grade 11 students at WP Sandin. Recipients have displayed leadership in human safety and protecting. They show kindness and compassion to fellow students or others present in the school. Students interested in advanced security, policing, or other forms of public safety preferred.

Award recipients will also be provided with an opportunity for a mentorship experience with Buckingham Security Services. Information regarding this experience will be provided directly to the recipients and their families through a representative from Buckingham Security and organized independently of the school.

*Criteria:*

- *Grade 11 student*
- *Display leadership in human safety and protecting*
- *Show kindness and compassion to fellow students or others present in the school*
- *Interested in advanced security, policing or other forms of public safety*
- *Student at WP Sandin Public High School*
- *Submit a reflective essay (maximum 500 words) or a video submission (4 minutes maximum) outlining how they meet the listed criteria.*

The selection committee will also take into consideration their professional knowledge of each applicant and how the applicant embodies the criteria described throughout their daily lives.
